

Letter to NYS Senator(s) In support of S4376 Re: Mandatory Vaccination

Dear Senator Oberacker:

Thank you for introducing Bill S4376 that prohibits a mandatory immunization against the coronavirus. I (we) am (are) grateful for your action and the recognition that we have authority over our own healthcare decisions.

I am particularly grateful that you specifically address children under 18:

NO CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN SHALL BE REQUIRED TO RECEIVE SUCH VACCINE AGAINST CORONAVIRUS UNLESS A PERSON IN A PARENTAL RELATION TO SUCH CHILD CHOOSES TO HAVE THE CHILD VACCINATED. FOR THE PURPOSE: OF THIS SUBDIVISION THE TERM "PERSON IN PARENTAL RELATION TO A CHILD" SHALL MEAN AND INCLUDE ANY PERSON WHO IS A PARENT OR LEGALLY APPOINTED GUARDIAN OF A CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN.

As you know, parental (grandparent/guardian) authority in recent weeks has been challenged with mandates and campaigns to have the children from age 5 to 18 vaccinated particularly while they enjoy a 99.9% survival rate should they have the virus.
